Council endorsement of the Climate Action Plan

Waterloo Region is on the cusp of something big! City and Regional Councils are right now considering endorsement the first-ever community action plan on climate change. With this Climate Action Plan acting as a direction for our collective efforts, Waterloo Region is

poised for a 6% GHG emissions reduction by 2020 (from 2010 levels).

On November 4th, Cambridge Council and Waterloo Council unanimously passed the recommendations to endorse the Climate Action Plan. As a member of this community, your voice counts. To show your support for the Climate Action Plan, we encourage you to attend one of the remaining Council meetings:

Dell's Next Big Sustainability Goal Requires Collaboration

As sustainable business practices go, Dell's <u>new 2020 Legacy of Good plan</u> unveiled Oct. 15 contains some pretty ambitious targets -- pretty much what we've come to expect from the one of the world's biggest high-tech companies. There are 21 targets in total, divided into environmental, social and community categories. One of the goals introduced by Michael Dell, the company's founder, chairman and CEO, is that over the next seven years, Dell seeks to generate 10 times more benefit through its technology than it takes to make and use it in the first place.

Pacific Islander seeks Climate Refugee Status in New Zealand

A Pacific Island man trying to flee rising seas and environmental risks caused by global warming in his home country of Kiribati asked a New Zealand court last Wednesday to let him pursue his claim as a climate change refugee. The low-lying South Pacific island nation has a population of more than 100,000, but its average height of 2 m. (6-1/2 feet) above sea level makes it one of the countries most vulnerable to rising waters and other climate change effects.

Environmental Commissioner to Release 2012/13 Annual Report

Gord Miller, the Environmental Commissioner of Ontario, released his annual 2012/2013 report last Thursday. The report is available <u>online</u>. The report, entitled *Serving the Public*, includes substantive reviews of ministry decisions, ministry responses to applications for review and investigation, and other environmental issues. <u>Topics covered include fracking regulations and air emissions from an Asphalt Blending Facility.</u>
