Canada's Environment Ministers Make Climate Change a Priority

Federal, provincial and territorial environment ministers agreed that climate change will be on the agenda for the Canadian Council of Ministers of the Environment (CCME) moving forward on an ongoing basis, with the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Paris as the topic of their meeting in 2015. After 2015, Ministers, in collaboration with senior officials, will decide the topic for the following years. Ministers agreed to work collaboratively within provincial and territorial jurisdictions to achieve real reductions in greenhouse gases, which will support economic competitiveness as Canada transitions to a low carbon economy.

300,000 March Against Climate Change in New York

An international day of action on climate change brought hundreds of thousands of people





onto the streets of New York City September 21, exceeding organizers' hopes for the largest protest on the issue in history. Organizers estimated that some 310,000 people, including United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, former US Vice President Al Gore, actor Leonardo DiCaprio and elected officials from the United States and abroad joined the People's Climate March, ahead of the UN-hosted summit in the city to discuss reducing carbon emissions that threaten the environment. The New York rally, the largest single protest ever held on the topic of climate change, followed similar events in 166 countries including Britain, France, Afghanistan and Bulgaria.

Nicholas Stern: The State of the Climate - And What We Might Do About It

The UN begins its first Climate Summit, enlisting the world to work together on a problem that's too big for any single country to solve alone. Economist Lord Nicholas Stern helped write a report that outlines where we are now — and what we could do next. It's a big vision for cooperation, with a payoff that goes far beyond averting disaster. He asks: How can we use this crisis to spur better lives for all?

Who Should Declare Climate Change a "Health Emergency"?

A leading medical journal has added its voice to calls for climate change to be declared a health emergency. The British Medical Journal, which has an international reach, last month published its first article purely on climate science. The editor, Fiona Godlee, said doctors needed to know the facts to become effective advocates on climate change. She urged the World Health Organization (WHO) to announce a global public health emergency in light of the threats-posed-by-rising-temperatures.

Carbon Credits Give \$664 Benefits Per Ton

Carbon-reduction projects generate benefits beyond climate protection of about \$664 per metric ton of emissions, according to an Imperial College London University survey. The study into 59 projects showed they bring ecosystem gains including soil protection, water regulation and biodiversity conservation, the university said. The survey's estimate compares with an average price of \$4.90 a metric ton in the voluntary carbon market, where companies and individuals buy credits, Ecosystem Marketplace data show.
