#### **Options for Climate Change Policy Well Characterized, Study says**

Policy options for climate change risk management are straightforward and have well understood strengths and weaknesses, according to a new study by the <a href="American Meteorological Society">American Meteorological Society</a> (AMS) Policy Program. "Large gaps remain in society's consideration of climate policy," said Paul Higgins, the author of the study. "This study can help in the development of a comprehensive strategy for climate change risk management because it explores a much larger set of policy options." Find out more about it here.

## ClimateScope 2014 - Global Study Shows Clean Energy Activity Surges in Developing World

Developing nations represent a large and rapidly growing share of the world's clean energy investment, according to Climatescope 2014 a <u>country-by-country assessment</u>, <u>interactive report and index</u>. The results suggest renewable technologies can be just as cost-competitive in emerging parts of the world as they are in richer nations. The findings show clean energy capacity added in these nations grew at a faster pace than in developed countries, more than doubling in the past five years. <u>Find out more about it here.</u>

Even though insurers are in the business of protecting others from risk, <u>a new report</u> shows that most major United States players are turning a blind eye to a serious threat to their own bottom line—climate change.
